- V. Resolutions

- a. Michael Dobson of Leon High School reported a resolution titled, "Prospective Voters Should be Permitted to Vote in Gubernatorial Primary Elections." The motion was thoroughly discussed and finally adopted, as follows:

**Resolved, that registered prospective voters in the state of Florida be permitted to vote in gubernatorial primary elections so long as they are able to vote in the general election.**

Motion was passed by unanimous consent.

- b. Milton High School reported a resolution titled "Implementing Recycling Programs," which was thoroughly discussed and finally adopted as follows:

**Resolved, that schools should implement a structured recycling program within their schools which provides a means for these materials to be appropriately recycled.**

With a vote of 11-6 motion passed.

- c. Jarryd Boyd of Pensacola High School reported a resolution titled “Congressional District Method of Distributing Electoral Votes,” which was thoroughly discussed and finally adopted as follows:

**Resolved, that the state of Florida adopt the Congressional District method as a means of distributing electoral votes in order to more fairly represent the popular vote.**

Motion was passed

- d. Kyle Avenarius of Pace High School reported a resolution titled “Uniform Exam Policy for all High School Students in Florida,” which was thoroughly discussed and

With a vote of 12-1 motion failed.

- e. Rutherford High School reported a resolution titled “FCAT Testing,” which was thoroughly discussed and finally adopted as follows:

**Resolved, that FCAT testing should not be a factor in determining whether a student is retained, and be it further**

**Resolved, that FCAT testing should not determine whether a student receives his or her diploma.**

With a vote of 9-7 motion passed.

- f. Booker T. Washington High School reported a resolution “School Health Inspections Monthly,” which was thoroughly discussed. Bay High School moved to amend this motion by striking the word “monthly” and replacing it with “quarterly.” The resolution was finally adopted as follows:

**Resolved, that all schools in Florida should be required to have quarterly inspections for school health purposes.**

With a vote of 16-1 amendment passed.

With a vote of 13-4 motion passed.

- g. Ryan Mayall of West Florida High School reported a resolution titled “Celiac Disease and School Lunches.” The resolution was amended to strike the phrase, “included on all school menus” and replace it with “replace all school menus.”

With 1 abstain and a vote of 9-7 amendment passed.

With a vote of 2-16 the motion failed.

- h. April Lee of Leon High School reported a resolution titled “Required Mathematics Credit in Florida,” which was thoroughly discussed, amended, and finally

With a vote of 3-12 motion failed

- i. Libby Lirette of Pace High School reported a resolution titled “Public School Facilities.” The amendment was thoroughly discussed and finally

With a vote of 3-14, motion failed.
